RIGHTS AND PERMISSIONS POLICY

ID-DRITT

The publication of contributions in 'Id-Dritt' (the 'journal') is subject to the author/s signing this Rights and Permissions Policy. The author is referred to as the 'author' whereas the Għaqda Studenti tal-Liġi or GhSL is referred to as the 'publisher'. The contribution is referred to as the 'contribution'.

1. Exclusivity

- 1.1. All contributions are deemed to be original writings. Contributions are accepted for publication with the understanding that their contents, all or in part, have not been published elsewhere and will not be published elsewhere, except in abstract form or by the express consent of the Publications Officer.
- 1.2. The author shall assign to the publisher the copyright to the contribution, whereby the publisher shall have the exclusive right to publish the said contribution and translations of it wholly or in part.
- 1.3. Publication of the contribution in the journal must be properly credited by the author wishing to publish the contribution in question.
- 1.4. The author must also declare that any person named as co-author of the contribution is aware of the fact and has agreed to being so named and shall be duly acknowledged.
- 1.5. The Author must warrant that the contribution does not infringe upon any copyright or other right(s), and that it does not contain infringing, libellous, obscene, or other unlawful matter, and that he/she is the sole and exclusive owner of the rights herein conveyed to the publisher. Whenever a passage from copyrighted material is quoted or used, reference thereto must be made. The author will indemnify the publisher for, and hold the publisher harmless from any loss, expense or damage occasioned by, any claim or suit by a third party for copyright infringement or arising out of any breach of the foregoing warranties as a result of publication of the contribution. The contribution shall be delivered to the publisher free of copyright charges.
- 1.6. The author shall receive for the rights granted in this policy a free copy of the issue of the journal in which the contribution is published and an electronic file of his/her contribution (digital offprint). The author warrants and represents that any personal use of the contribution by the author will be limited to the use permitted by the rights reserved to the author as specified below.
- 1.7. The author retains the right to make copies and distribute copies of the contribution, as communicated to him in the digital offprint sent to him by the publisher for own personal use, including for own classroom teaching use and to research colleagues, for personal use by such colleagues, and the right to present the contribution at meetings or conferences and to distribute copies of the contribution to the delegates attending the meeting.
- 1.8. The author retains the right to republish the Contribution in any printed collection or otherwise without charge only after the lapse of three (3) months from the date of the official launch of the journal. This includes the right to use the contribution to further the author's career by including the contribution in other publications such as a thesis and/or collection of articles, provided acknowledgement is given to the original source of the publication.
- 1.9. The Author may post the contribution on his/her own personal website or that of the company with which he/she is affiliated free of charge, provided appropriate acknowledgment to the journal is made.

2. Conflict of Interest Policy

- 2.1. Once a submission is accepted by the Editorial Board, the author will be required to disclose all potential conflicts of interest in the first footnote of the published version.
- 2.2. Authors must identify any organisations that provided funding for the research or writing of the contribution, as well as any personal or family financial interests that might be pertinent. The Editorial Board's offer for publication is contingent upon authors' compliance with this conflict-of-interest policy.

3. Disclaimer

- 3.1. The Author acknowledges and accepts that the Publisher will need to process the Author's personal data requested below for the purpose of fulfilling the obligations arising from or in connection with this Agreement. These obligations may include editorial, printing, production and distribution as well as promotional and product development activities. The Publisher will engage (sub) processors if necessary, in which cases a Data Processing Agreement will always be in place.
- 3.2. All rights are reserved to Għaqda Studenti tal-Liġi (GħSL). Any opinions expressed in any of the contributions published do not represent the views of either the Editorial Board or those of GħSL.

The author hereby commits himself/herself to the terms and conditions contained in this policy. This policy is governed by Maltese law, and any dispute that may arise shall be brought before the appropriate court of law in Malta. Electronic signatures and content are deemed to have equal weight to signatures and content inserted in wet ink.
